

SINGAPORE TOURISM ORGANISED TWO-CITY ROADSHOW IN INDIA



Fernando Hierro joins Vicente del Bosque, the legendary Spanish football coach, who was named Ambassador for Responsible Tourism last year in January during the annual UNWTO Awards for Tourism Innovation.



KERALA PROPOSES FUNDING FOR TOURISM DEVELOPMENT AND MARKETING

The tourism arena in Kerala will receive added support from the government with the state budget 2018 setting aside close to Rs 381 crore towards development and promotion of the sector. The budgetary provisioning is Rs 36 crore more than the Rs 345 crore that was set aside last year. Presenting the Budget in the Kerala Assembly, Dr Thomas Isaac, Minister for Finance, said the state government will focus more on conservation and preservation of heritage monuments in the coming financial year.

The Finance Minister set aside Rs 82.50 crore towards marketing of the tourism sector. The government also proposes to bring boat races under the league competitions, and will be supported with an amount of Rs 10 crore. An amount of Rs 4.95 crore has been earmarked towards Responsible Tourism initiatives, while development of eco-tourism products would get Rs 4.24 crore. The Finance Minister also proposed to set aside Rs 13.75 crore towards infrastructure facilities and matching grants for Central Government-sponsored schemes.



Q: Great food you enjoyed and where?





he magic of healing! The million dollar question...how does one create harmony of body, mind and soul? Is it at all possible? We don't know the intricacies that create bonds of well-being within the body, but definitely at some subconscious level, we try to get the balance right between body, mind and soul.


Physicians and psychiatrists have long understood the connect between disease on the one hand and lifestyle on the other. Lifestyle encompasses diet, exercise, mental and emotional equilibrium. We know from experience that our body, mind and soul are deeply connected and each has a domino effect on the rest of the system.


INDIAN TRADITIONAL MEDICINE

The interesting fact is that we, in India, have an ancient understanding of the art of healing in a holistic fashion and several treatises, scriptures and books have immortalised various healing systems such as Yoga, Ayurveda, Vedanta, Chakra Meditation, Unani, homeopathy, Siddha or Naturopathy, Music, Painting, and so on.

Alternative healing helps through the therapy and the technique used, as well as relaxing the patient's mind.

The wonderful part of healing in India is that a seeker can experience the fabric of the country in its living traditions. Awe- inspiring Hindu temples, Buddhist stupas and Islamic mausoleums showcase a great history. As international and domestic visitors reach out to sages and rishis in ashrams and luxury resorts to teach ancient practices, alternate healing practices in India continue their popularity run.





While Yoga is popular as a system of physical exercise in the West, Yoga in Indian traditions, has a meditative and spiritual core in addition to physical benefits.

In India, Yoga and meditation are treated as one entity of holistic healing. Well known Yoga exercises like Surya Namaskar, which regulates digestion, agility and longevity, and Pranayama or breathing exercises, which regulate the 'prana' or vital force in a human, are practised alongside meditation.

This energy healing practice works on the understanding that our bodies should be in sync with the energy system of the universe. We need to practise to bring harmony to this latticework of energies, vibrating at different frequencies, encompassing the physical, mental, emotional and spiritual aspects.

Trust the Indians to perfect the system of Yoga through Mudras, which is a study that indicates which points in our body vibrate to different energies and how we can bring this philosophy into play.

Ancient India practices include Mudras – the simple practise of joining different combinations of the fingers and thumbs. It is believed that the body is a miniature form of the universe: earth, water, fire, air and space, each of which corresponds to a specific finger or thumb.

Holding specific fingers and thumb combinations permit the elements to regain equilibrium. Generally, Mudras are practised during 'Pranayama' (Yogic breathing exercises) to achieve peace and spiritual energy and to channel energy to areas of the body that require healing.

INDIAN HEALING TRADITIONS-UNANI, RASASHASTRA, SIDDHA AND SA-RIGPA TRADITIONS

It is amazing how vast amounts of medical knowledge have been handed through generations to modern times. Today, traditional healing practices like Ayurveda, Unani and Siddha have entered the mainstream to complement bio-medicine to meet the healthcare needs of contemporary society.

There are other formal systems of medicine, such as Unani, Rasashastra, Siddha, and Sa-Rigpa.

Unani is an Arab medical tradition with origins in the Greek Ionian medicine, which has absorbed elements of Ayurveda and other sources.



Rasashastra is an ancient tradition of healing that uses medicines incorporating metals, especially mercury and gold, which are purified using complex procedures. The tradition maintains that Rasa formulations, in association with Yogic and Tantric practices, give extraordinary powers like arresting the process of ageing. Certain Rasa medicines were incorporated into Ayurveda and Siddha.

The Siddha tradition is an ancient South Indian system that developed especially in the Tamil speaking region and continues to be popular there. It integrates elements of Ayurveda, Rasashastra, Yoga and Tantra and uses alchemically prepared metals along with medicinal plants. The Siddha system is said to have been influenced by contacts with Chinese and Arab medicine.

The Sa-Rigpa tradition practised in Tibet and Himalayan regions is an amalgam of Ayurveda, derived from Vagbhata's Ashtangahrdayam and folk practices, along with a strong influence of Tibetan Buddhism.

The hereditary Ashtavaidya Ayurveda physicians of Kerala are among a small group of traditional medical practitioners who have endeavoured to retain the scholarly study and practices of their ancestors.

Drawing and painting can be traced to Ajanta Cave (Maharashtra) paintings, which contain the oldest known Indian paintings of historical time - from the 2nd century BC. Historians argue that Bhimbetka Rock Shelters (Madya Pradesh) may contain some of the oldest paintings made by humans. There are 15,000-year oldpaintings and petroglyphs which are more than 290,000 years old. As a form of communication be it story telling or recording an event, this activity is

The Rig Veda, written more than 5,000 years ago and is one of the oldest human records written in India describes the healing essences of herbs. Several archaeo-botanical excavations and medical treatises in the Gangetic plains of India prove the deep knowledge and use of medicinal and sacred healing plants since the 2nd millennium BCE which are still used by Ayurvedic physicians.

According to Ayurveda, the inherent qualities of various medicinal herbs and flowers harmonise the individual body and are used to prevent infections, purify the air, and energise or relax the body.



Ancient Indian texts mention sophisticated methods of concentrating the aromas. The extraction method was often perfected in the form of steam distillation.

Today, of course, these ancient healing practices have been further refined and available in treatment centres, spas and ashrams.

MUSIC THERAPY

The magical power of music to soothe and enhance psychological mood is legendary. We have all experienced it. Not surprisingly, Music Therapy as a belief system and its integrated approach in treatment of ailments is clinically and globally supported by medical practioners.

In India, a unique characteristic of classical music is the allocation of definite times of the day or night or even seasons to perform or listen to 'Raga' melodies. Specific ragas are prescribed for ailments as it is believed that they are able to stimulate the pituitary gland, which secretes hormones that affect the nervous system and the flow of blood. Ancient texts describe how Ragas help activate the seven energy Chakras in the body.

In fact, a music library at Thanjavur in Southern India is reported to contain a study of ragas in their application in fighting common ailments.

This belief system has been in practice in ancient India as Raga Chikitcha. Today, ancient healing Indian music forms like Nadayoga, Vedic Chanting and Raga Chikitcha are being studied by music therapy institutions.

Interestingly, the traditionally vast repertoire of 'kirtans', 'kritis' and 'bhajans,' which are devotional in nature, has hugely beneficial psychological values.

Physicians cite stories of people in semi-vegetative states returning to consciousness through a recalled melody or patients finding their memory through musical tunes. Music as a pain reducer or its ability to help partially paralysed people as they cue their walking to a piece of music, combined with physical therapy, is a common medical practice. Learning to play the guitar or the piano, singing lessons or simply hearing music helps the emotionally stressed.

HEALING AND FULLFILMENT

Healing as a renewing process that soothes, calms and rejuvenates body, mind and soul is a sought after elixir, because it brings a guaranteed quality of life in its wake.

In the last few decades, there has been growing interest in alternative forms of therapy globally. While this has stimulated the development of tourism for well-being in India, there is no doubt that alternate healing centres, institutions, spas, hotels and ashrams offering different kinds of simplified holistic treatments in the country, have finally come of age.





GRACE BAY BEACH, CARIBBEAN



The gradually rolling waves, echoing a stronger sound with each progression, the waft of cool air brushing against the skin, and the waters disappearing into the distance, all present a wonderful setting for simply whiling away one's time, lost in deep contemplation and purposeful rumination. RADHANAGAR BEACH, ANDAMAN, INDIA

THE WONDER THAT'S INDIA


A land of unlimited wonders, India is a kaleidoscope of culture, heritage, spiritual healing, folklore and the arts. Today's Traveller showcases some of these many wonders



nation of great diversity, a confluence of cultures dating back to thousands of years, India has been rightly summed up as 'a subcontinent of nationalities.' The country has seen numerous emperors and foreign rulers, thereby contributing to a rich treasure trove of cultures and customs. With the varied cultures come the various eras in history, each with their own particulars in various forms and shapes, thereby creating a nation of varied interests. In this vast land, one can find historical relics, scattered across its length and breadth, standing as testimonies to the concept of a subcontinent of nationalities. Taking a leaf out from India's many wonders, Today's Traveller brings you a few that present a historically and culturally diverse nation.

KONARK SUN TEMPLE

Located in Puri district, Odisha, The Sun Temple of Konark is a fascinating old structure, which is a culmination of Oriya



architecture. Built in 13th century by King Narasimhadeva, the temple is designed in the shape of a colossal chariot with seven horses and twelve wheels, carrying the sun god Surya, across the heavens.

The name Konark comes from the amalgamation of two Sanskrit works, 'Kona' meaning 'corner' and 'Arka' meaning 'sun.'

The Sun temple comprises a sanctum with a lofty (over 68m high) sikhara, a jagamohana (30sq.m. and 30m high) and a detached nata-mandira (hall of dance) in the same axis, besides numerous subsidiary shrines. The temple used to be referred to as the Black Pagoda in earlier days, by the Europeans.

KHAJURAO GROUP OF TEMPLES


Located in the state of Madhya Pradesh, Khajurao is a fascinating temple complex that is visited by tourists from across the world. Built by the Chandella rulers, between AD 900 and 1130, during the golden period of the Chandela dynasty, it is believed that every Chandela ruler built at least one temple here.

The intricately carved erotic designs are much revered and considered to be one of the finest examples of temple

carvings. The images sculpted on the temple walls actually represent the divine Shakti and Shiva, the male and female principles. The temple is scattered over an area of 9sq.m and some are dedicated to the Jain pantheon and the rest to Hindu deities – to the holy trilogy of Brahma, Vishnu and Shiva and various Devi forms, such as the Devi Jagadambi. The temple complex is under the UNESCO World Heritage's protected sites.

AJANTA AND ELLORA CAVES

Significant discoveries in the history of India, the Ajanta and Ellora Caves have been inducted in the UNESCO's list of World Heritage Sites. The caves depict paintings beginning with the 2nd century and continuing to the 6th century AD, inspired by Buddhism. The Ajanta caves are located 107km from Aurangabad and 60km from Jalgaon. Comprising 32 caves, it is a protected site under the aegis of the Archaeological Survey of India. e Ellora Caves consist of 34 caves, which are Buddhist, Hindu and Jain religious monuments carved in rock. The caves consist of Chaitya shrines which are dedicated to Lord Buddha and Viharas (monasteries) used by Buddhist monks for meditation and the study of Buddhist teachings.



Also, Cave 16 in Ellora houses the famous Kailasa temple, the abode of Lord Shiva.

GOLDEN TEMPLE

Also known as Sri Harminder Sahib, the Golden Temple is the spiritual abode of the Sikhs and is located in Amritsar, Punjab. The central focus of the Temple is the tank around which the shrine stands. The tank, known as Amrit Sarovar, from which Amritsar takes its name, was excavated by guru Ram Das, the fourth guru of the Sikhs, in the year 1577.

The holy book, Guru Granth Sahib, is installed every morning inside the temple and is later returned to the Akal Takhat at night. The Golden Temple has an elegantly carved marble section at the lower level, above which is the shimmering second level in gold panels. The tip of this is a


golden dome of 750kg of gold. Inside, one could lose oneself in the exceptionally soothing music and chanting from the Guru Granth Sahib, as performed by priests and musicians throughout the day.

HUMAYUN'S TOMB

Built in the year 1770, Humayun's Tomb, located in New Delhi's Nizaamuddin East, is of great cultural and historical significance and is considered to be the first garden-tomb in the Indian subcontinent.

The incredible architecture of the tomb has inspired many others, including the famous Taj Mahal. The tomb stands at the centre of the square garden and is divided into four main parterres, known as 'charbaghs,' in the centre of which ran shallow water-channels. The high rubble-built enclosure is





entered through two lofty double-storeyed gateways on the west and south. A baradari (pavilion) occupies the centre of the eastern wall and a hammam (bath chamber) in the centre of the northern wall.


The tomb has many rulers of the Mughal dynasty buried here, including Humayun, for whom it was built. The tomb has now been restored and is open to visitors.


TAJ MAHAL

Located on the banks of the River Yamuna, in Agra, the Taj Mahal is widely revered in India and abroad. The ivory-white

marble mausoleum was commissioned by the then Mughal emperor, Shah Jahan, in 1632 AD, to house the tomb of his favourite wife, Mumtaz Mahal. Initially, the mosque, the guest house and the main gateway on the south were completed in 1648 AD; later, the outer courtyard and its cloisters were added to complete it in 1653 AD.

Considered to be the epitome of love, the Taj Mahal is a hot favourite among couples coming to visit India. In terms of architecture, the structure is in perfect balance of composition, the octagonal tomb chamber in the centre, encompassed by the portal halls and the four corner rooms.





CITY PALACE

Located on the banks of Lake Pichola, Udaipur City Palace is the most visited tourist attraction of the city. Its construction was initially started by Maharana Udai Singh, but the present form of the Palace had been renovated by his successors. The assortment of courtyards, pavilions, terraces, rooms and hanging gardens exhibit the history of the region. City Palace is structured in a way that it offers a splendid 360-degree view of the entire city and the lake from all its balconies and towers.

Encircled by fortifications, City Palace majestically reflects a blend of Medieval, European and Chinese Architecture. There are 11 wonderful palaces within the site, and each one holds a special place in the annals of history. While the architecture of the City Palace speaks volumes about the history of the Rajputs, tourists are also interested in its in-house shopping complexes, which include unique indigenous attires and decorative items.

MYSURU PALACE

Situated at the home of the Wodeyars who once ruled Mysuru for more than 500 years, Mysuru Palace is an architectural reflection of the city's quaint charm. The palace's royal lineage can be traced back to 1399, which served as the official residence of the Wodeyar dynasty. The palace was designed by Henry Irwin and it stands as one of the finest achievements of Indo-Saracenic architecture. Popular attractions inside the palace include the Ambavilasa, Gombe Thotti (Doll's Pavilion), Kalyana Mantapa and Public Darbar Hall. The dramatic three-storeyed stone building with its majestic interiors and decorative frescoes is an enduring reminder of the history of the Mysuru maharajas.

FAR FROM THE MADDING CROWD

Take the road less travelled and visit some offbeat destinations in Kerala for a satisfying and meaningful travel experience

opular destinations are enticing enough for a visit, however, with the constant thronging of tourists, accompanied with all the usual revelries and merry-making, they tend to lose some of their charm. Amongst many factors, one which attracts people to places is the tranquillity of a place. Kerala has earned its fame for its beautiful backwaters, soothing massages steeped in Ayurvedic traditions and natural beauty, which extends to every nook and corner of the land. While many of these witness and attract a constant inflow of tourists the year round, there are many off beat destinations that remain to be explored and will work wonders to uplift sagging spirits and senses.

KUMBALANGI VILLAGE, COCHIN

Kumbalangi is a quiet little village seated on the outskirts of the city of Kochi, and is enveloped by the legendary Kerala backwaters. But, that is not what lends to its fascinating quality. The village contains a treasure of rich aquatic life, made possible by an array of mangroves which separate the land from the water, thus providing a breeding ground for crabs, prawns, oysters, and small fishes. Apart from tasting the delectable cuisine consumed in the village, it's a delight walking on village roads surrounded by greenery, going on a fishing trip, or simply marvelling at the gently-flowing waters.

KUTTANAD, ALAPPUZHA

Kuttanad is a village that has earned the distinction of being a rice granary, and one where farming is carried out below sea level. The place is known as the rice granary of Kerala, one where enormous stretches of paddy fields interweave with the exciting backwaters to create a fabulous sight. It's a privilege watching the typical village sights – men tilling the land and labouring and women carrying their lunch boxes to the fields. This village is also replete with a robust avian population, with flocks of parrots flying lazily above the paddy fields, creating a happy setting.

BANASURA SAGAR DAM, KALPETTA

The idea of Banasura Sagar Dam was conceived as part of the Indian Banasura Sagar Project, and it is now the largest dam in India and second largest in Asia. Located about 15km from Kalpetta, its spectacular beauty is derived from the chain of mountains standing majestically in the background. Legend has it that King Banasura performed severe penance on these hills, and thus, they were named in honour of him. During the monsoons in particular, this place becomes a photographer's delight, as the small islands dotting the crystal clear water are visible during this time. Besides, the scenic background also serves as the starting point for trekking enthusiasts.





BEYPORE, KOZHIKODE

This place traces its history to ancient times, and as such, is a pilgrimage site for historians, who are quite enchanted by its defining beauty, and the history embedded in it. Beypore is greeted by the waters of the Chaliyar River, and served as a major port for trade and maritime centre in earlier times. Its historic value lies in its shipbuilding industry, which goes back to more than 1500 years. The construction of Uru, or the Arabian trading vessel as it is called, is pursued with an undying enthusiasm here, and watching the men at work, deftly crafting the intricate woodwork into perfection, is such a delight.

PONMUDI HILL STATION, THIRUVANANTHAPURAM

About 61km away from Thiruvananthapuram is the beautiful hill station of Ponmudi. It is characterised by the typical traits of a hill station, with its cool and quiet environs, undisturbed solitude and narrow winding roads disappearing into the distance. The eminence which Kerala has earned for its tea gardens can also be witnessed at their best here, along with the dancing mountain flowers and the mist-covered valleys. Besides, the feeling of losing yourself in the environs of the hills, or simply going on a trek is simply indescribable.

ith the diversity of tribal communities in India, Odisha takes centre stage for cultural and traditional glorification. The tribal communities of the state have successfully contributed to its history and heritage. Odisha's tribes remain in isolation and away from the urban legend and under nature's guidance, thereby expressing a cultural identity that is unique.

This uniqueness includes a distinguished language, rituals, festivals, dress, ornaments and arts and craft. In order to understand the true spirit of the state, one must delve deep into its traditional aspect. The skills of the tribal people are omnipresent in all aspects of art, such as, dress, ornaments, wall paintings, handicrafts, wood carvings, dance and music.

TRIBAL CULTURE AND HANDLOOM

There are 62 tribes residing in different parts of Odisha. Each tribe has its own social organisation within which it works and lives. The dormitory is known to be the core of a village culture, where traditions are reinforced. In Odisha, the Juangs call it Majang, and Durbar; the Kondhs call it Dindaghar, the Buhyans call it

Dhangarabasa and the Bondos call it Ingersin. This dormitory is much like the school of dance and expression where the elders assemble every day for important events. Matters related to the welfare of the village are also discussed here. One could well refer to these dormitories as the hub of the social, economic and religious life of the village. The different attires of these tribal communities depend on their surrounding and their necessity. While some tribes such as the Bondi and Gadaba weave their own clothes, there are others who purchase their apparel from another community.

The tribes of Odisha use their indigenous materials in order to weave their clothes and use bamboo and other trees to get the fibre. A wooden loom is installed in front of the house or in the backyard, and some are installed in the narrow path of the village.

Both men and women partake in weaving the indigenous

clothing. The tribes take great pride in their traditional attire and use different costumes for each ceremony or festival. Interestingly, a tribal women's dress





varies throughout her life as attires change according to the various stages of life. These gorgeous traditional attires can be witnessed in the remote areas of the state and are of great interest to tourists.

HANDICRAFTS

This rural art form is an exceptionally skilful work that requires an intricate eye for detail and a knack for art and craft. Odisha is popular among tourists for its skilled craftsmen who produce some of the most astonishingly beautiful handicrafts, mainly metal, Saora paintings and pottery.

POTTERY

The craftsmen of the state create a variety of roof tiles, and utensils such as pots, bowls, plates and jars. Cooking stoves are used to meet daily life requirements. Potters also create figures like bulls, elephants and horses, which act as symbols of the state.



CANE, BAMBOO, REEDS, GRASSES AND WOOD

All of these items are used as raw materials by the craftsman to give shape to their masterpieces. Bamboo is used for its structural qualities, high tensile strength and pliability, while cane is used for its elasticity and sturdiness and is beneficial for domestic use, like a stool. Reeds and local fibres are used to make ropes, strings, brooms, etc.

SANTHAL AND SAORA PAINTINGS

Santhal and Saora tribal paintings of Odisha reflect a unique and admirable glimpse into the culture of the state. The wall mural paintings are dedicated to a particular deity as the practice is an integral part of religious ceremonies. Today, the paintings have become popular among tourists as they buy souvenirs like greeting cards and clothing items adorned with Santhal and Saora art.







LEAF STRAW AND DRIED FLOWERS

Tribal women happen to be traditional gatherers of leaves, which are used to design hats for farm grazers and labourers. Also, food is served in leaf plates and bowls in the temples and villages during feasts. It is a hygienic and durable technique which helps protect the environment.

METAL

Tribal Odisha plays a big role in some very interesting pieces that are crafted using metal. The techniques and form of production combine both the functional and the aesthetic style. From the riveting of flexible brass fishes, snakes and crocodiles of Phulbani district, to the tiny bronze-cast beads shaped like grains, metal is almost omnipresent in the tribal areas of Odisha.

TAMIL NADU: DIVINE STATE

A rich cultural heritage, incredible pilgrimage and eco-tourism sites, besides being a leading medical destination – Tamil Nadu is distinctive in every way

rage among tourists. A glimpse of Tamil Nadu's diverse heritage can be obtained by a stopover at some of the following sanctuaries – The Indira Gandhi Wildlife Sanctuary and National Park houses a range of wild animals, including the macaque, tiger, panther, elephant, gaur, etc. Other sanctuaries include Mudumalai Wildlife Sanctuary, Mukkurthi National Park, amongst others.

A separate Eco-Tourism Wing has been established by Tamil Nadu Tourism Development Corporation (TTDC) to promote sustainable eco-tourism by integrating facilities at the hill stations, waterfalls, forests, bird sanctuaries, wildlife sanctuaries and national parks to woo tourists. Various packages will be developed to promote Eco-Tourism in the state on a sustainable basis.

AWESOME HERITAGE

Tamil Nadu's rich cultural heritage is a major draw. The state is blessed with five World Heritage Sites, the highest for any state - The rock-cut monuments at Mamallapuram, the Big Temple at Thanjavur, the Iravadiswara Temple at Darasuram, the Brahadeeswarar Temple at Gangaikondacholapuram and the Nilgiris Mountain Railway.

Heritage building owners are encouraged by the Tourism department to convert heritage buildings into heritage hotels. Kanadukathan, a Chettinad village, 15 km from Karaikudi, is a heritage village, with unique architecture, expansive courtyards, intricate woodwork and a peaceful ambience. Chettinad Mansion offers a variety of rural activities, including distinctive Chettinad cuisine, plus a cycle or bullock cart ride and to see the 170-odd mansions in the Chettinad area.

The State Government has declared 48 tourist places in Tamil Nadu as Heritage Places. The Heritage places declared by UNESCO in Tamil Nadu will be linked with temples in Trichy, Madurai, Chidambaram, Rameswaram, Tiruvanamalai, Thanjavur, Kumbakonam, Nagapattinam, Tirukadaiyur, Gunaseelam and six abodes of Lord Muruga, which attract a drove of visitors.

Tiruvannamalai expends a profound spiritual energy, attracting both pilgrims and spiritual seekers. Rameshwaram is a peaceful little pilgrim town, where devotees pay obeisance at the Ramanathaswamy Temple. Ancient Madurai in Tamil Nadu is home to the most impressive and important temple in South India – the Meenakshi Temple. Kanyakumari, located





on the furthermost tip of India, houses the Swami Vivekananda Memorial and the towering statue of Tamil poet Thiruvalluvar, located on a rocky island off the shore. Kanchipuram, the "City of a Thousand Temples," is also famous for its silk saris. Kanchipuram, Mammallapuram and Chennai are often referred to as Tamil Nadu's Golden Triangle for tourists.

WELLNESS IS ALL

Tamil Nadu is one of the leading medical destinations in India. Well-equipped corporate hospitals, less waiting time and skilled medical professionals are what brings medical tourists from afar, especially from the UK, UAE, Singapore, Malaysia, Mauritius, African countries, Maldives, and West Bengal, and the Northeastern states of India.

ADVENTURE TRAVEL

Adventure Tourism is gaining much popularity among tourists. Trekking in low altitude hill areas, paragliding in Yelagiri, water sports offered by Muttukadu and Mudaliarkuppam Boat Houses are some of the innovative sports activities promoted under Adventure Tourism.

REFRESHINGLY RURAL

Rural tourism is all set to gain recognition in Tamilnadu with Navabashanam, Theerthamalai, Vadanemmeli and Tirupudaimaruthur getting a nod from the Tamil Nadu Government. These villages are ideal destinations to enjoy rural life, savour rural cuisine, see culture and tradition, explore nature, for trekking and visiting temples.

BRANDENBURG GATE

An 18th century neo-classical monument, Brandenburg Gate is Berlin's most famous historical landmark that once divided the city. After the fall of Berlin in November 1989, Brandenburg Gate reinvented itself into a symbol of peace and unity. The Gate, erected between 1788 and 1791, was designed by architect Carl Gotthard Langhans, who was inspired by the Propylaea in Athens' Acropolis. After visiting the monument, travellers can stop at the "Raum der Stille" (Room of Silence), situated in the north wing, for a quiet break.

POTSDAMER PLATZ

Located in the heart of the city, Potsdamer Platz is a must visit, with its fusion of modern architecture, restaurants, shopping centres, cinemas and theatres. The Potsdamer Platz today is vastly different from its earlier avatar, and its rebirth in the early 1990s was Europe's biggest building project. The buildings were designed by international star architects Renzo Piano, Richard Rogers and Arata Isozaki. In the span of five years, the site, which earlier used to be a wasteland with the Berlin Wall, transformed to a new urban centre. The glasstented Sony Center and the Panoramapunkt observation deck are the main attractions of the site.



MUSEUMSINSEL

Berlin's Museumsinsel or Museum Island houses an outstanding ensemble of five world-renowned museums and boasts works from Ancient Egypt, Byzantium and Berlin. With over 6000 years' worth of art, artefacts and sculptures, the five grand museums were built between 1830 and 1930. The island's top attraction, the Pergamon Museum, attracts around one million visitors annually, for its remarkable Ishtar Gate, Processional Way, and the fascinating collection in the Museum of Islamic Art. The Bode-Museum houses and extensive collection of medieval sculptures.



REICHSTAG

Situated in proximity to Brandenburg Gate, Reichstag had been burnt, bombed, rebuilt, and finally turned into the modern home of the German Parliament. After the reunification, the site had undergone restoration and renovation under the direction of British architect Norman Foster. Its most distinctive feature is the glittering glass dome ,which sits directly above the debating chamber. A mirrored cone at its centre directs light into the Reichstag, increasing the building's energy efficiency and letting visitors view the parliamentary proceedings below.





BERLIN WALL

From August 13, 1961, until November 9, 1989, the Berlin Wall divided the city into East and West Berlin. In 1990, more than 100 artists came together from over 20 countries to decorate the stretch with their art works. The East Side Gallery is the longest surviving stretch of the Wall and people can locate the traces of the Wall all across the city. Of the innumerable and eye-catching artwork on the remnants of the Berlin Wall, the most famous is the 'Fraternal Kiss,' depicting a kiss between Russian leader Leonid Brezhnev and East Germany's SED Party Chairman, Erich Honecker.



JEWISH MUSEUM

An architectural wonder, the Jewish Museum strikes visitors with its zigzag shapes and sharp angles. The museum artistically narrates the 2000 years of Jewish history in Germany. The whole structure (inside and out) reflects the life of the Jews. Architect Daniel Libeskind's building unfurls in zigzagging corridors and empty spaces, known as 'voids', which appear throughout the structure, and are not accessible until you reach the Memory Void - reminding visitors of the voids left behind as a result of the Holocaust.



MUSIC: VANCE JOY, NATION OF TWO

Though he has not made a major mark among the masses, Australian Indie folk singer/songwriter, Vance Joy is notably known for his 2013 catchy folk-pop single, 'Riptide.' Born James Keogh, Joy has finally released his second studio album, Nation of Two. The opening song of the

track is,'Call If You Need Me,' which is also called 'Fluorescent Light Song'. 'I'm With You' and 'Lay It On Me' are other popular tracks, which have proved to be early live favourites. 


